

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: WHEN ENCOUNTERING ICE AT HOME



## DO

- Verbally and calmly assert your rights (ie. "I do not consent to you entering.")
- Ask to see a badge
- Ask to see a warrant
- Ask for the copy of the warrant
- Ask that the warrant be slipped under the door or put up against a window for you to view
- Make sure the warrant has come from a court
- Look for a judge's signature on the warrant
- Make sure the warrant isn't a DHS document
- Review the limitations set within any valid warrant (They're not allowed to search outside of the specified area in a valid and signed judicial warrant without your consent.)
- Ask any officer or agent you find in your home to step outside and affirmatively state that you do not consent to them being inside the home



## DO NOT

- Open the door unless you know and are expecting the visitor
  - Allow roommates, minor children, visitors, or others to answer the door
  - Allow neighbors, your landlord, workers, or anyone to confirm your identity or share your location
  - Allow officers or agents of any kind inside
  - Consent to any searches
  - Show false, foreign, or expired documents
- Lie - Instead of confirming whether a person lives there or not, state that you do not wish to answer questions
- Sign any documents you do not understand
- Answer any questions
